



Minneapolis Police Department 2008 Neighborhood Policing Plan *Mid-City Industrial Neighborhood*

Introduction:

Mid-City Industrial Area is an industrial park in Second Precinct. While it is not a separate neighborhood, the density of industry in the area, the area provides unique challenges and opportunities that may differ from the residential and other business areas of the same neighborhoods.

Overview:

Mid-City Industrial Area is bordered 35W on the north and west, Hennepin Avenue East on the South, and 33rd Avenue SE to the East.

Crime Statistics:

In 2007, crime increase in the Mid-City Industrial Neighborhood by 7%. Theft and burglary are the most frequent crimes, with theft being 64% and burglary being 27% of the reported crimes. The increases in crime occurred during the warmer months when the businesses reported a problem with drag racing, in addition to the crime.

(Note: Mid-City does not have separate crime reporting; crime patterns are a compilation of area overlay from other neighborhoods.)

Focus for 2008 (remains the same as 2007):

- Theft
- Burglary

Neighborhood Concerns:

The precinct, security patrols, manufacturers and other companies discuss current areas of concerns as they arise.

2008 Policing Strategy (remains the same as 2007):

- The Minneapolis Police Department will be providing (a packet of) information to businesses in the Mid-City Industrial Area regarding business security.
- There will be an increase in the number of people using the city technology to obtain information on crime alerts, crime prevention, etc.

Neighborhood Engagement:

The packet of information which the MPD will deliver to the businesses will include a business information card, information on business security, etc. It will be the responsibility of the businesses to take the steps that they choose to increase their security

2008 Performance Measures:

Continue to provide police presence and monitor area.
Continue outreach to business; meet and advise as needed.

MID-CITY 2007 NEIGHBORHOOD PLAN RESULTS

Neighborhood Concerns:

The precinct, security patrols, manufacturers and other companies discuss current areas of concerns as they arise.

2007 Policing Strategy:

- The Minneapolis Police Department will be providing information to businesses in the Mid-City Industrial Area regarding business security. **Meetings and advisements continue as needed. Informational packets were started, but not completed. Will be continuing during 2008.**
- There will be an increase in the number of people using the city technology to obtain information on crime alerts, crime prevention, etc. **There is no specific measure, but due to interest and feedback from the community, there has been an increase.**

2007 Results:

The MPD worked and made progress on decreasing the drag racing problems in the area. The MPD and the businesses would like to see the same strategy and goals for 2008. Burglary which is 27% of the crime in the neighborhood and theft which is 64% of the crime in the neighborhood during 2007 should remain the major focus of the neighborhood.
