



Minneapolis Police Department 2009 Neighborhood Policing Plan *Mid-City Industrial Neighborhood*

Introduction:

Mid-City Industrial Area is an industrial park in Second Precinct. While it is not a separate neighborhood, the density of industry in the area, the area provides unique challenges and opportunities that may differ from the residential and other business areas of the same neighborhoods.

Overview:

Mid-City Industrial Area is bordered 35W on the north and west, Hennepin Avenue East on the South, and 33rd Avenue SE to the East.

Crime Statistics:

In 2008, crime increased in the Mid-City Industrial Neighborhood by 19%. Theft and assaults were the crimes that saw the greatest increase; theft increasing from 68 to 98 and assaults increasing from 1 to 5. There was a decrease in burglaries by -52% and motor vehicle theft by -63%.

(Note: Mid-City does not have separate crime reporting; crime patterns are a compilation of area overlay from other neighborhoods.)

- Theft
- Assaults
- Burglary

2009 Policing Strategy:

- Provide information to businesses in the Mid-City Industrial Area regarding business security and work place violence.
- The Crime Prevention Specialist will distribute crime alerts when necessary.
- The Crime Prevention Specialist will educate the community to all the online resources that are available to them for use in their business community.
