### Task Force Purpose and Charge

**Purpose:** A coalition of multi-jurisdictional and community partners who are collectively working to develop a coordinated plan to reduce opioid abuse, dependence, and overdose in Minneapolis and to address treatment and recovery strategies that are culturally-specific and evidence-based.

**Charge:** To confront the region's growing opioid epidemic, recommend a comprehensive strategy that focuses on action around the areas of prevention, increasing access to treatment on demand, harm reduction, and reducing the number of fatal overdoses. By the end of the first quarter 2019, the task-force will present an opioid action plan to the Mayor and City Council
