

Amendments to the 2017 General Appropriation Resolution
Adopted by City Council Dec. 7, 2016

1. Goodman amendment: Transfer \$250,000 from Meet Minneapolis to the Public Works Department to be dedicated to the Downtown Improvement District for community-based policing strategies.
2. Goodman and A. Johnson amendment: Authorize \$115,000 and 1 new Full-time Equivalent (FTE) to the Community Planning and Economic Development Department (CPED) to undertake business retention and expansion activities for small and medium size businesses and to work in partnership with the small business support team.
3. Bender, Glidden, Gordon, Palmisano, Warsame, and Reich amendment: Increase of \$67,000 to the Health Department for the Next Step Hospital-based Violence Intervention Program.
4. Cano and Gordon amendment: Direct Finance and Property Services Department to explore scenarios to divest and stop doing business with financial institutions that invest in the fossil fuel industry and projects such as the Dakota Access Pipeline, and report recommendations to the Ways & Means Committee no later than end of second quarter 2017; the report shall explore the possibility of establishing a municipal bank or participating in a publicly-owned banking operation.
5. Warsame amendment: Allocate \$100,000 from the Police Special Revenue Fund for public safety priority investments in the Ventura Village and Phillips West Neighborhoods.
6. Glidden and Warsame amendment: Transfer \$100,000 from the City Attorney's Office to the Civil Rights Department for 1 FTE in the Civil Rights Department, Complaint Investigation Division. Direct the Civil Rights Department to assign staff to coordinate response and information regarding hate speech and crimes, as well as acts of discrimination within the City and with intergovernmental and community partners.
7. Gordon, Cano, A. Johnson, Glidden, and Reich amendment: Direct Finance and Property Services Department to provide Vikings Stadium financial oversight, and report to the Community Development & Regulatory Services Committee on the desirability and feasibility of reopening the Park Use Agreement between the City and the Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority (MSFA). Direct IGR staff to draft supportive legislation creating an enforcement mechanism that will ensure that city and state stadium spending caps are honored.
8. Cano amendment: Allocate an amount not to exceed \$75,000 to the Health Department for culturally relevant community-based intervention and street outreach strategies to help the transgender, American Indian, and young women and girl victims of sex trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation. Direct Finance and Property Services Department to report recommendations by June 30, 2017, to the Mayor for ongoing funding of this effort.
9. Palmisano amendment: Direct City Coordinator's Office to work with partners in the Youth Coordinating Board and the Mayor's Office, in conjunction with the City of Saint Paul, to explore the feasibility of a sustainable, scalable universal pre-kindergarten program across both cities that could eventually be implemented statewide. Staff will report to Committee of the Whole by September 19, 2017.

10. B. Johnson and Yang amendment: Direct Finance and Property Services Department to ensure that at least \$250,000 of the \$500,000 allocated for Collaborative Safety Strategies be directed towards work along West Broadway Ave in North Minneapolis, to be distributed to groups or organizations which have shown a long history of collaborative work along West Broadway and who bring together business and community members and who employ staff focused solely on the improvement and safety of West Broadway. Staff will report to the Public Safety, Civil Rights & Emergency Management Committee by March 15, 2017.

11. B. Johnson and Yang amendment: Allocate \$100,000 to CPED for Summit Academy's contextualized GED Program.
