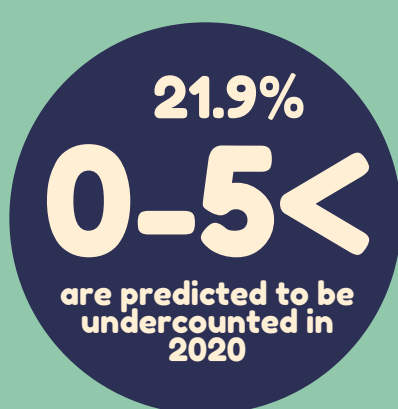
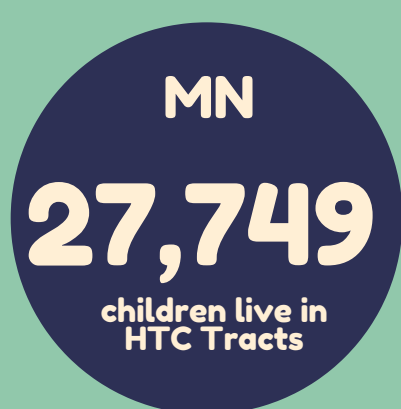


OUR CHILDREN ARE MISSING

Each year, Census and ACS data help to determine hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding for health care & human services programs.
