



CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR NEW HIRES GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES

The City of Minneapolis has an ordinance requiring employees fixed after December 1, 1993, to become residents of the City and to <u>maintain</u> their residency within the City limits as a condition of employment.

WHO IS COVERED BY THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT?

The residency requirement currently covers employees in departments under the jurisdiction of the City Council and Mayor, the Minneapolis Public Library, and Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board. It does not apply to employees of the Minneapolis Board of Education, Neighborhood Revitalization Program, Youth Coordinating Board, or persons appointed to a temporary position from any union hiring hall list. A copy of the Residency Ordinance is available for your review from your hiring authority.

WHEN IS RESIDENCY REQUIRED?

If you started working in a PERMANENT CLASSIFIED position after December 1, 1993, you must establish and maintain residency within the corporate boundaries of the City of Minneapolis within six (6) months from the date of the successful completion of your probationary period. (For example: employees having a 12-month probalionary period must provide verification of City residency within 18 months of their initial start date).

If you started working in a TEMPORARY position after December 1, 1993, and have worked 1,400 hours in any 18month period, you must establish and maintain residency within the corporate boundaries of the City of Minneapolis within 18 months of the date of first employment or within 60 days after reaching 1,400 hours, whichever is later.

ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION

You are required to provide evidence that you live within the boundaries of the City of Minneapolis. Acceptable evidence includes ONE of the following AND a signed notarized affidavit:

- * Mortgage / lease agreement or deed; or
- ' Driver's license or other photo ID issued by the State of Minnesota; or
- * Vehicle registration form; or
- * Vehicle insurance form

If you do not have one of the items listed above, or if your residency is in doubt, you may be asked to present other evidence of residency, which may be (but is not limited to):

- * Homestead application/records
- * Dental Insurance Records * Utility Bills
- * Income Tax Statements
 * Bank Statements/Records
- * Other Official Identification Cards with Photo and Address
- * Household Insurance
- * Medical Insurance Records

(Affidavit Form can be found on the back of this page)

SUBMIT EVIDENCE OF RESIDENCY TO YOUR SUPERVISOR

If you are currently a resident, you should present your documentation and signed affidavit form to your supervisor immediately. If you are not currently a resident, you must submit evidence of residency within the time limits noted above. Your supervisor will verify that you have complied with the residency requirement. In addition, ongoing verification of residency will be required on a random basis as determined by the department, to verify your continued status as a Minneapolis city resident. (Note: some City departments will be requiring employees to submit proof to a central source within their department. Check with your supervisor to clarify how your department will be handling this).

RESIDENCY IS REQUIRED FOR CONTINUED EMPLOYMENT. The residency requirement is a continuing condition of employment for covered employees in the classified service. Failure to become a resident or maintain residency is considered a loss of an essential job qualification and will result in discharge from your position.

A RECOMMENDATION FOR TEMPORARY WAIVER - CLASSIFIED SERVICE

Your appointing authority may grant a waiver or waivers of the residency requirement not to exceed a total of 30 days. A covered employee must request from the Civil Service Commission, a waiver of longer than 30 days, or appeal the denial by the appointing authority of a requested waiver.

Employees may appeal a recommendation for discipline relating to the residency requirement in the same manner and form as in any other disciplinary action.

Good Morning Chief Harteau and Chief Arneson.

I would like to respectfully bring to your attention something that really surprised me today at the P1 Immigration Protest. As we were working the event, I casually asked 5gt. Dave Hansen if BRRT has ever received the Chief's Unit Citation Award. I was very surprised by Dave's answer. He told me, "No. We have never received the award as a unit." This really floored me. I would have thought BRRT would have at least received one during the RNC Convention. I had not been on BRRT at the time and saw how much action and involvement they had at the RNC Convention. Watching them is what made me want to ioin BRRT.

Over the years, BRRT had been used, but not near as much as in the last 15 months. I cannot even tell you how many BRRT details I have been on during this time. I have seen BRRT in many contentious and trying situations. I am proud to see how BRRT has risen to the occasion. One thing I constantly hear at the incident Action Plan Briefings is how much the Incident Commanders like having us there and rely on us to do much of the work. Many have told me in private, after the briefings, that they are relieved BRRT was utilized. I have also heard many IC's, Inspectors, and Lieutenants tell me that they think having the bikes during marches are the best bang for the buck the department has. At a 3rd Precinct march last summer, I was surprised to hear other sergeants repeatedly compliment on us on how proficient and useful we were.

Do not get me wrong. I am not trying to brag. I just believe that Sgt. Dave Hansen has done an unbelievable job as the unit leader. I do not think anyone on the department will be able to fill his shoes. Everyone on BRRT has the utmost respect for him and appreciates his strong leadership. I honestly do not believe there is a better BRRT leader in the country. I believe he deserves to be recognized for what contribution he has made for our department. He was tasked with starting a bike program, creating BRRT teams, and professionalizing the unit. I think he has done an unbelievable job.

Today, kind of blew me away. As you know, the Immigration March was the biggest one I have ever seen in my 22 years on the department. I couldn't believe when I was blocking traffic at 7th Street and Hennepin, that as the last few marchers were marching through, the lead squad aired that the group was arriving back at the Federal Building. 7th Street was completely packed the entire way, all lanes of traffic. We estimated the crowd at 10,000. I was surprised when the Star and Tribune only estimated 5,000. Nevertheless, this was the biggest crowd I have ever seen. It was difficult to escort them, but I was proud at how the 14 BRRT members were as mobile and rapidly able to move and assist as we had done. When we staged at the end, I kid you not that we had several hundred protestors go out of their way to walk up to us and thank us for keeping them safe during the march. For whatever reason, everyone seems to like a bike cop.

I also am proud how BRRT members have stepped up time and time again. Today, we were requested at 0752 hours and we still were able to form a team only several hours prior to the event. This to me is astonishing as you know how many officers on the department would probably say, "No way!" at the

thought of being outside on a bike for 4 hours with no opportunities to warm up. BRRT is usually the most used and last unit expected to stay, even in the coldest weather.

I would like to formally nominate and bring to your attention the fact that the BRRT unit has never received a Unit Citation Award. It would be a disappointment for me not to see Sgt, Daye Hansen recognized for his achievements.

Please excuse the fact that I jumped the chain of command emailing you two directly. I did so as this recognition and honor as it is only yours to give. Also, please see that this is not me asking for selfish recognition. I would gladly be happy for you to skip me for the award but please give the award to the unit and all other BRRT members as I believe they deserve it.

On 8/9/2004, officers from the 1st Pct were dispatched to a jumper on the Stone Arch Bridge. Officers arrived and were directed by witnesses to the middle of the bridge, where a female had climbed over the rail.

Officers arrived and Officer Schmitt began to have a conversation with the female, who was on the South side of the bridge. Below the female was a large concrete pad and then the river. As Officer Schmitt talked to the female I had Officer Kubes, Hansen, Lanasa, Grossinger get behind the female and waited for Officer Schmitt to talk with the female. She refused to look at Officer Schmitt and continued to stare down at the water. This female was talking a little about her husband cheating on her and that she wanted to be alone. During this time the female was facing out toward the water.

I directed Officer Kubes to grab the female around the neck area, due to the fact that she was very short and there was not much else to grab on to, and hang on to her and then the other officers all grabbed what they could. Officer Lanasa went back to his squad and grabbed a long leash that we then were able to wrap around the female. At this time Officer Schmitt climbed over the rail and was pinning the female against the railing. I spoke with the feamale to calm her down and explain to her what we were going to do.

Officer Lanasa and Schmitt were able to get her to turn so she was facing the bridge and we were able to get her pulled back onto the bridge.

I believe all officers acted calmly and resolved a dangerous situation with no injury to officers or the sucidial female. I am writing these officers up for the professional way they handled this incident without reguard for their own safety.

On 9-12-05, at approximately 0129 hours, Officer Jason Schmitt assisted in the 1st Precinct on a Shooting / Aggravated Robbery Of Person, that occurred at Youth Link, 41 North 12th Street.

Officer Schmitt arrived on the scene first and located the victim. Officer Schmitt noticed that the victim had substantial blood loss from a gunshot wound to the hip and that the victim was not doing well. Officer Schmitt immediately administered first aid to the victim by applying direct pressure over the femoral artery at the groin until HCMC EMS arrived.

Officer Schmitt accompanied the victim to HCMC where the victim was taken to the Stab Room and then to the Surgical Intensive Care Unit.

I received a call from Michael Rogers, HCMC EMS Supervisor, who wanted to recognize the excellent job that Officer Schmitt did in rendering first aid to the victim. Mr. Rogers told me that he believed the victim was in a life and death situation and that the quick action of Officer Schmitt applying direct pressure to the wound to slow/stop the bleeding gave the paramedics a few precious minutes to stabilize the victim who was slipping into unconciousness. Officer Schmitt was instrumental in saving the victim's life.

Attached is the letter from Mr. Rogers, Officer Schmitt's supplement and my supplement.

I would like to recommend Officer Schmitt for the Life Saving Award.

On 01/23/14 at approximately 1849 Hours Officers Aikins and Schmitt were working Squad 520 when they observed a vehicle traveling east on Lake Street from Nicollet without its headlights on. Officers were westbound at the time and Officer Aikins activated the flashers on the Squad in order to make a U-Turn. Officers got behind the vehicle with its flashers still on as it turned north onto 1st Avenue. The vehicle started to accelerate and Officers attempted to catch up to the vehicle in an attempt to stop it. The vehicle continued to accelerate, so Officer Aikins activated the overheads along with the siren. Officer Schmitt advised dispatch they were in a Chase.

The vehicle, a Mitsubishi Galant, turned onto Cecil Neumann and then attempted to turn south on Nicollet Ave. The vehicle was unable to negotiate the turn and spun out, and its front end was very close to the Squads front end at this time. Officers were clearly able to see the driver, later ID's as A1 BLAND, NAHSHON LATROY 09/23/94, along with another front seat passenger and one in the rear.

The vehicle took off nearly ramming the Squad and it was now heading east the wrong way on Cecil Neumann, and then turned south onto 1st Avenue which is a one way going north at a high rate of speed. There was traffic heading north on 1st avenue that pulled to the side of the Avenue. Officers continued the pursuit. Once the vehicle reached Lake Street it turned east and then struck a Ford Explorer, which was east on Lake going through the intersection. It should be noted there were no injuries to the driver of the Ford. The PD caused significant damage to the Suspect Vehicle and it was now disabled.

A1 bailed out of the vehicle as it continued to roll. Officer Schmitt gave chase on foot east on Lake and then north on Stevens. A1 was holding his waistband as if he may have a gun as he ran. A1 circled back west behind a business and was cutting through the Money Express parking lot. Two citizens pointed that he ran west on Lake Street and Officer Schmitt checked the businesses and observed A1 inside Money Express removing his black hooded sweatshirt. Officer Schmitt entered the business and ordered A1 to the ground at gunpoint. A1 hesitated at

first, but after multiple verbal commands he finally complied. A1 was then handcuffed and taken into custody.

Traffic responded to the scene for the accident, and Officers learned that the Suspect vehicle was a fresh stolen out of Robbinsdale.

A1, BLAND, was booked and later charged with Felony Fleeing Police in a Motor Vehicle. Bland has 22 CAPRS entries where he has been arrested for WEAPONS, ROBPAG, TFPER, BURGTL and ASLT2.

Dear Sgt. Holly Keegel,

I would to thank Officer Schmitt for his assistance in rendering aid to a shooting victim in the area of 12th and Hawthorne. When I arrived on scene, the paramedics and I were unsure of the location of the patient. It took us a couple of minutes to locate Officer Schmitt and the patient that were somewhat hidden from our view due to some trees in the area. Once we located Officer Schmitt, I could see that Officer Schmitt was applying direct pressure to the patient wound.

After examining the patient, the patient was not doing well, while we were "packaging her" she started to slip into unconsciousness, the pt was very pale, the patient had lost a significant amount of blood.

In the 20 years of being a paramedic on the streets with HCMC EMS, you get to know death quite well. The victim in my estimation was in a life and death situation. I feel strongly that Officer Schmitt's quick action of applying direct pressure to the wounds of the victim prior to our arrival , slowed or stopped the bleeding, giving the paramedics a precious few minutes to get the IV, G-suit, and oxygen going, stabilizing her while transporting her to HCMC's Stabilization Room.

I would like to say "Thank You" again for your actions. It is not everyday that we can make a difference in someone's life. Today you made a difference.

I want to highlight an excellent, textbook response by your 5th Pct. Sgt's, and officers regarding this case. Sgt. Dudgeon called me around midnight to notify me she had arrested a CSCR/Burglary suspect and wanted to review suspect/scene evidence gathering. After going over the case, it was clear that she already had a good handle on what needed to be done. The victim was brought in for a sexual assault exam, the suspect's mouth was swabbed and car 21 processed the scene whereby they located the suspects fingerprint on a door handle.

This is crucial for the investigators when interviewing a suspect. Regardless if there is any evidence, we can confront them with the "possibility that it may be there". In this case, the suspect initially denied entering the apartments or having any contact with the esc victim. When told that the victim had a sexual assault exam, he gave admissions that "it might have happened". Same was true with the scene processing- he admitted being in both apartments "to check on their welfare".


Additionally, Sgt. Goset did an excellent job with the show-up, both in the same and all officers wrote complete.

There is always a lot of follow up on these cases, and very little time to accomplish this. By calling me, I was able to get an investigator, Sgt. Brian Carlson, on the case early in the morning. As a result, Kirk Warren Jones was charged with four felony counts, two for 1st degree burglary and two for 3rd degree CSCR.

These are the kind of reports and actions that make it easy for investigations to move forward on the hard work of the officers.

In December of 2018 an overdose death occurred in the City of Minneapolis where a victim named Mary Fairley died due to Cocaine and Fentanyl toxicity In this case (18-416437) it provided a witness who gave the name of the source of supply of Fairley's drugs ingested. This suspected individual was named Relando Devon Hall 03/22/1982. This death sparked a follow up investigation into the salesman of the illegal narcotics provided to the victim in this case.

Officer Danielle Eyans and SGT John Biederman began to link suspects involved in the sale of this laced narcofics. A search warrant was conducted at Hall's apartment by the Second Precinct CRT Unit where a man named Anthony Akemu Abari 12/30/1980 who was present. During this search warrant Abari was found to have over 100 grams of Heroin and Fentanyl along with an illegal firearm.

With cell phone search warrants conducted on Hall and Abari's phones along with toll analysis on the victim's cell phones, common phone numbers began to match and Officer Evans and SGT Biederman were able to establish a conspiracy amongst salesman. This investigation showed that specifically they were selling and mixing Fentanyl to customers.

During the investigation these suspects committed several crimes that Officer Evans and SGT Biederman could attribute to them. Abari was identified as a suspect in a shooting (19.044949.) Both Hall and Abari were identified as suspects in an armed robbery and shooting (19-045882.) Abari was arrested for another firearm in his vehicle (19-048126) and in the recovery of this firearm a NIEIN match occurred with this firearm and was found to be the same on used in the armed robbery. Officer Evans also orchestrated an undercover buy using UC MPD Officers to purchase Crack and Heroin from Relando Hall (19-209631.)

During Officer Evans and SGT Biederman's investigation a phone number emerged for another source of supply in the conspiracy which matched a separate investigation that Officer Jason Schmitt of the Weapons Investigations Unit was conducting.

Officer Schmitt initiated this investigation into the narcotics trafficking of Kevin "Stunna" Green. Green was known to have a previous conviction for narcotics trafficking in 2007 and was released from Federal Prison in 2018. During the course of the investigation. Officer S source of heroin supply, primarily in the 3rd precinct (chmitt learned that Green is a significant

On July 8, 2019, Officer Schmitt and the Weapons Investigation Unit executed a search warrant at Green's residence in Burnsville. The result was the recovery of \$196,921 in US Currency, 298.8 grams of raw heroin, and four vehicles including a Bentley Sedan (purchased in the last week), a Porsche Cayenne SUV, heroin, and four vehicles including a Bentley Sedan (purchased in the last week), a Porsche Cayenne SUV, an Atdi AS SUV, and a BMW 7 series sedan. In addition, officers seized approximately \$100,000 in Jewely from the scene. Green and his co-conspirator girlfriend named Minnie Loyd 5/1/1985, have both been charged in State Court at this time and the case has been accepted by the US Attorney's Office for Federal charging (indictments pending).

In a related action on this case, on 7/11/19, Officer Schmitt and the Weapons Investigations Unit executed a search warrant on co-conspirator Leon Mooney at his apartment in Eagan, MN. Mooney is actively search warrant, officers recovered an trafficking narcoties in Minneapolis' 3rd and 5th precincts. During this search warrant, officers recovered an additional amount of crack cocaine, marijuana and \$19,607 in US Currency. Charges are pending against Mooney, but are expected to be filed today in Dakota County.

On July 9th, 2019 Officer Danielle Evans had presented charges for the trio of the co-conspirators to the US Attomey's Office for consideration in charges for Kevin Green, Relando Hall and Anthony Abari. On August 12th, 2019 Officer Evans attended the Grand Jury proceedings for Green, Hall and Abari and they were indicated on the following counts in US District Court: Title 21, US Code, sections 841 (a) (1); 841 (b) (1) (a) and 846.

- #1) Possession with intent to distribute controlled substances
- #2) Conspiracy to distribute controlled substances
- #3) Felon in possession of a firearm (Abari and Hall)

Officer Eyans and Schmitt along with SGT John Biederman should be recognized for Excellence in Investigation for their excellent case work in relation to the initial over dose death of Mary Fairley. The Investigation for their excellent cases working in conjunction with each other to distribute both Heroin and Cocaine three identified sources working in conjunction with each other to distribute both Heroin and Cocaine three with their own Fentanyl are looking at collective times in the US Federal Prison system of 120 to 144 months. The large recovery amounts of Heroin, US Currency and seizure of narcotics assets and firearms are evidence of the large expansive organization defeated!

SGT Biederman, Officer Evans and Schmitt have proven themselves to be relentless investigators and the investigation of Green, Hall and Abari are great examples of their success. Throughout this investigation they tirolessly analyzed data on the activities of all the suspects involved and made the indictments seamless. They also received and shared information with multiple inner and outer agency Law seamless. This sharing of information learned from the investigation assisted the Violent Crimes Investigations Division and Heimepin County Attorney's Officer in solving and charging other violent crimes in the City of Minneapolis.

I work firsthand with all three of these investigators daily and know that they passionately serve the Violent Crimes Division, Weapons Unit and the City of Minneapolis residents by providing daily Trust, Accountability and Professional Service. They are highly deserving of this and many other awards for Excellence in Investigation.

35W Bridge Collapse Awards

On August 1st 2007 at 6:05 PM the first 911 call was received regarding the 35W Bridge collapse. The 35W Bridge was 1900 feet long and handled 140,000 vehicles on an average day. At the time of the collapse 180 people and 120 vehicles were on the bridge deck, this tragic event resulted in 13 deaths and 100's of injuries.

- · The first emergency units were on the scene almost immediately.
- Within the first 2 hours 505 911 calls had been received. By 7:55 PM all of the survivors had been rescued from the scene.
- Within 3 hours of the collapse, the Family assistance center was set up at a local hotel.

Nearly 100 different agencies Police and Fire both local and federal responded, including the Park, U of M and St. Paul Police Departments.

The decision to create this year's special category of awards came about after weeks of watching the brave and tireless response of all those involved.

The criteria for these "Bridge Awards" were developed by the MPD Awards Committee after receiving submissions from individual's supervisors and peers. The submissions were reviewed and voted on by the Awards Committee.

Each of our awardees has a compelling story of their own of their part in the rescue and recovery efforts. Tonight, we would like to take this opportunity to recognize this group of officers and non-sworn staff.

We will be presenting regular department awards including Merits, Commendations, Medals of Valor and Medals of Honor. In addition, an Appreciation Award (Bridge Plaque) has been created for non sworn staff or non MPD law enforcement personnel to acknowledge there contribution to the bridge collapse.

Medal of Honor - is awarded to those officers that were the first officers to arrive within minutes at the disaster site. These officers braved extreme conditions and scaled the collapsed walls and bridge debris to search for, extricate and rescue people. These officers put their lives on the line in their attempts to rescue victims from exploding and burning vehicles. In addition, these officers pulled survivors and the victims who had died at the scene from vehicles on the deck and vehicles submerged in water.
