COMMON THEMES

- Impact of traffic calming treatments on winter maintenance
- Effectiveness of traffic calming treatments
- Need for Bicycle facilities and/or bike lanes
- Addition of greening to traffic calming treatments
- Slowing driver speeds along the route

DEMONSTRATION PROJECT FEEDBACK

- "Bollards on corners can make it hard for plows, ice builds up"
- "Collect traffic data on demo installs speed, full stop, rolling, and yield to pedestrians"
- "Bollards are ineffective"

CURB EXTENSION FEEDBACK

- "Will bump outs affect snow emergencies, plowing and parking?"
- "Can we do curb extensions w/the closed medians if ok with Metro Transit?"
- "Can we add bump outs to a raised crossing?

TRAFFIC CIRCLE FEEDBACK

- "Plowing and street sweeping are tricky around traffic circles"
- Multiple requests for traffic circles along multiple intersections west of 21st on 32nd St (in front of South High)


