divisions

ADMINISTRATION

This office supports the various divisions within the department with general administration, budget and systems management, community outreach, Human Resources and staff development as well as policies and procedures.

SURFACE WATER & SEWER

This division is responsible for the storm water system management, sanitary sewer as well as maintaining and enhancing public infrastructure such as pipes, tunnels, pumps and ponds. This division follows federal and state regulations and works closely with the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board.

SOLID WASTE & RECYCLING SERVICES

This division controls the city's garbage, recycling and yard waste pick-up for approximately 105,000 residential customers. It also promotes recycling including the single-sort conversion completed in June 2013, increasing recycling weight by 50%.

WATER TREATMENT & DISTRIBUTION SERVICES

Primary responsibility is treatment, distribution and maintenance of water for Minneapolis and surrounding communities. This staff is also in charge of water connections and permits.

FLEET SERVICES

Responsible for vehicle supply with approximately 1,900 cars, light trucks and heavy trucks in inventory. Management and maintenance is also a large part of this division including an average of 20,000 repair orders each year.

TRANSPORTATION ENGINEERING & DESIGN

Responsible for the design and project management of the City's transportation related projects (streets, streetscapes, bridges). Also responsible for pavement and Right of Way management, special assessments and Public Works' Engineering Lab.

TRAFFIC & PARKING SERVICES

Responsible for traffic management including signs, signals and lane striping. Owns and maintains 13 parking ramps, designs, installs and maintains 16,000 streetlights and oversees the Bike and Pedestrian Program and the impound lot.

TRANSPORTATION MAINTENANCE & REPAIR

Manages the reactive maintenance such as potholes as well as preventative maintenance such as joint sealing and seal coating. Responsible for street sweeping and snow and ice control; plowing 1,000 miles of street and 378 miles of alleys. This division also does bridge maintenance and street and sidewalk repair.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNING & PROGRAMMING

Oversees long-term traffic planning that emphasizes alternate modes of transportation (bicycle, pedestrian, light rail). Also responsible for short and long-term asset management planning as it relates to transportation and transit infrastructure.
